



Oklahoma's Promise Fact Sheet

Every Oklahoma's Promise eligible student must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students selected for verification must submit requested documentation and have verification completed before they are eligible to have a claim submitted or their potential funding. Oklahoma's Promise eligibility will be lost for any year the income reported on the FAFSA exceeds \$100,000. The five-year period of scholarship eligibility includes periods of ineligibility.

Oklahoma's Promise no longer funds non-credit (remedial courses); therefore, carefully plan your enrollment.

OSU-Oklahoma City **degree seeking** students who are eligible must:

- **Enroll** in non-remedial courses
- Have the current year's FAFSA on file at OSU-OKC
- Submit requested documentation for federal aid verification, if selected
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy requirements

OSU-Oklahoma City **non-degree** seeking students must:

- **Enroll** in non-remedial courses
- Have the current year's FAFSA on file at OSU-OKC
- Submit the [Oklahoma's Promise Eligibility Certification](#) form, completed by your home school, **each** semester of enrollment
- Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy requirements at their home school

OSU-Oklahoma City will claim funds each semester immediately following the add/drop deadline. Students should allow a *minimum* of two weeks processing time for funds receipt. Detailed information including scholarship benefits and conditions are located at <https://www.okhighered.org/okpromise/>.
