ADMISSION PROFILE

The OSU – Oklahoma City Division of Human Services is accepting new students into the Bachelor of Technology in Emergency Responder Administration.

Selection of students for admission to the program will be done following an established application process that affords applicants a fair and equitable process for selection.

Required Documentation for Admission

1) Applicant will complete the OSU – OKC Application for Admission. The application is located on-line at www.osuokc.edu or may be picked up at the Admissions Office found on the first floor of the OSU-OKC Student Center.

2) Once admitted to the Institution, student will complete an application packet for admission into the BT/ERA degree program. This packet is available from the Advisement Center on the first floor of the Student Center or at the Human Services Education Center (HSEC) located on south end of campus, 3401 West Reno or on line at http://www.osuokc.edu/era/pdf/BT-ERA_Application.pdf . Or by phone at 405-945-9199.

A completed BT/ERA application packet will include:

- a. The completed Student Application for Admission into the Bachelors of Technology in Emergency Responder Administration
- b. One official copy of all transcripts from all colleges/universities that the student has attended. Include the transcripts in the application packet
- c. Immunization waiver form that can be found online at <http://www.osuokc.edu/download/immunization.pdf>
- d. ****To be eligible to apply to this degree program, applicants must have completed an Associate of Applied Science or A.A.S. degree in Police Science, Criminal Justice, Law Enforcement, Municipal Fire Protection, Fire Science, Emergency Medical Services, Paramedic, Emergency Management, Disaster Planning, Crime Scene Investigation, Corrections, Probation, and or Crime Victims Advocate from OSU-OKC or other accredited 2 year colleges. This will be evaluated with each application separately case by case. Other Public safety related degree plans can be approved through the BT-ERA Department Head.**

- e. A minimum graduation retention GPA of 2.0
- f. Official documentation of any certifications or licensures applicant holds (i.e.: CLEET certification, Licensed Paramedic, etc.)
- g. Applicants who submit an incomplete Admission Packet will not be considered for admission to the BT/ERA program.**
