


## **Critical Response Guide**

<u>**Definition:**</u> A critical response paper calls for the writer to respond to a text. Think of this as a critique of how the author of your text presents their main points. Perhaps you think the author does a good job and you would like to discuss the strengths in the text, or perhaps you would like to discuss how the author could have improved their message. Either way, your opinion matters.
