<u>Definition:</u> An introduction is the first paragraph (or several paragraphs) of your essay. The conclusion is the last paragraph (or several paragraphs) of your essay.

## **Introduction:**

The introduction is made up of three parts:

- 1. Hook (1-2 sentences) The hook is an interesting fact, quote, or statement that hooks the reader in, causing them to be interested in your essay.
- 2. Bridge (3-4 sentences) This is where you include any background information necessary for your reader to understand the topics/themes you will cover in the essay.
- 3. Thesis (1–2 sentences) This is the main point of your essay. If you had to sum up the main message of your essay into a single sentence or two, then that is your thesis.

## **Conclusion:**

The introduction is made up of three parts:

- 1. Restate Thesis (1-2 sentences) Restate but also reword your thesis from the introduction to remind the reader of your overall main point in your essay.
- 2. Summary (3-4 sentences) Summarize the main points that appeared throughout the body of your essay.
- 3. Final Thought (1–2 sentences) Finish strong! One great way to provide a final thought is a look to the future or discuss the impact of the topic of your essay.
